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NOTE: s.113(g) states while a voting station is open and during counting the votes not more than two scrutineers of each candidate may be present at the voting station.

Instructions for Scrutineers

Become familiar with the rules governing the conduct of the voting station

(All number references made are to sections of *The Elections Act*)

A SCRUTINEER MUST:

- 114(1)(b) (1) bring to the voting station a written appointment signed by the candidate or official agent and show it to the Voting Officer at each voting station at which they attend,
114(1)(c) (2) swear or affirm an Oath of Secrecy in Form 507 in the Oath Book upon arriving at the voting station,
123(1) (3) maintain and aid in maintaining the secrecy of the voting,
116 (4) if challenging a voter, have reasonable grounds for doing so, (eg. not qualified, already voted, providing false information) and state those grounds. The Voting Officer will record the grounds of the challenge, along with the scrutineer's name, in the voting book.

A SCRUTINEER MAY:

- (1) enter and remain in the voting place
113(g) (A) during voting hours
111(1) (B) 15 minutes before the voting station is open, and
158 (C) After the voting station is closed until the counting of the votes at the voting station is completed.
111(1) (2) if present at the voting place before the opening of the voting station, require the ballot papers to be counted in their presence and inspect the ballot papers and all other documents relating to the voting station.
114(2)(b) (3) at the convenience of the Voting Officer, examine the voters list,
114(2)(c) (4) be provided by the Assistant Voting Officer with a record of voters who have voted on Form 540 at intervals determined by Elections Manitoba,
121(4) (5) accompany the Voting Officer when moving a ballot box,
116(1 & 5) (6) challenge any person believed not to be a qualified voter, to have already voted, to be personating a voter or providing false information and require such person to take the Oath after Challenge in Form 506,
140(4), 159 (7) sign the Statement of the Vote and all seals and envelopes as a witness to proper closure and sealing,
135(1), 140(1), 150, (8) if present at the close of the voting station, observe the ballot papers during the count, object to any ballots and have these objections recorded in the voting book, and the ballot endorsed accordingly by the Voting Officer,
156, 159 (9) wear a badge or ribbon which by colour alone indicates the candidate for whom he/she is a scrutineer, but may not otherwise wear or do anything that may identify the candidate or political party he/she represents.
124(6)

A SCRUTINEER MUST NOT:

- 116(5) (1) disrupt the proceedings of the voting station in any manner except to request someone to take the Oath after Challenge in Form 506.
123(1) (2) attempt to influence voters, interfere with voters, attempt to discover how voters voted, reveal how voters voted or intend to vote, or attempt to induce a voter to show their marked ballot,
194(1), 194(3) (3) argue with the Voting Officer or Assistant Voting Officer about the operation of the voting station. The Voting Officer's decision is final in all respects. The scrutineer may contact the candidate's headquarters or the returning officer in the event of disagreement,
124(1) (4) campaign at the voting station.
